Thinking of Applying for a FIAP Distinction in 2024?

Please be aware that due to a delay in the submission of the 2023 Applications it has been necessary to amend the SPF processing dates for receipt of all future FIAP Distinctions Applications.

- 1. All applications should now be sent to be received by the SPF FIAP Liaison Officer between the 1 March and 15 May annually, instead of by our previous mid-January date.
- 2. Please wait for the 2024 paperwork appearing on the SPF website before submitting any Applications.
- 3. Also please note that, from 2024 onwards, Print Acceptances are again required for AFIAP and EFIAP.

One-to-one feedback will be available from various assessors available on the day.

This PAGB format event will allow you to gain an overview of the PAGB Awards scheme, with a presentation by the PAGB APM Chairman Rod Wheelans, providing lots of information and showing many examples of successful images.

There will also be an opportunity for individuals to have their images critiqued with regard to the level of Award you may be ready to apply for now or in the future. You can bring PDI which will be projected for advice to be given or prints, which need not be mounted.

The PAGB team attending, will include Rod Wheelans, Gordon Jenkins, Richard Speirs & Libby Smith. Additional experienced SPF assessors will also be present on the day to give feedback on your work.

These may be the very prints they are looking for!


If you think it would help - and it isn't compulsory - send up to 400words, telling us what you feel about your images and what you hope we will take from them.

You may hand in your MASTERS OF PRINT entries at the Adjudications for the Awards for Photographic Merit in Nottingham and Smethwick on 25/26 November, at the PAGB Workshop in Dunblane on 18 November, or the following day at the SPF PDI Championship, or at the NCPF Western Area Battle on 2 December. Plus, Gordon Jenkins, Richard Speirs, Libby Smith and Rod Wheelans will accept your entries if you can catch up with them somewhere before 2 December. (You must, of course, enter online in advance).

If you are posting your entries, please don't overwrap them. It takes lots of time unsealing yards of tape, layers of cardboard, tissue and foam and I took two carloads of waste to the local refuse centre last time. It is especially wasteful to put your prints in expensive plastic sleeves which are quite unnecessary. A simple stiff envelope with one extra card insert or an empty inkjet paper box is usually sufficient. Please, don't use tubes as it is almost impossible to fully uncurl the prints.

How to enter the MASTERS OF PRINT (MOP)

This event allows you to enter as an Individual or you can organise an entry on behalf of your Club. You should be a bona fide member of a Club affiliated to the PAGB (which all SPF member Clubs are) but you may only enter for one Club each year.

Entries, either by an Individual or by a Club, must be made through the PAGB on-line Entries System. This includes PDI copies of your prints 2400 pixels on the longest side.

The system provides a download of labels, with barcodes, which must be fixed to the back of each Print. When viewed from the back, the label should be placed as close as possible to the top right corner. In addition to the Print labels, the system provides a download of documentation to be sent to the Organisers with the Prints. You enter via the PAGB CES Website which will require you to register as an Individual and/or as a Club if you are not already registered. (click here)

60 Prints are then selected for the Exhibition (max one per author), and awards

are made to individual prints. In addition to this, every entrant receives a copy of this year's superb "coffee table" photobook featuring all of the Accepted photographs, one per page.

Successful entrants, on signature of the archive photobooks, receive a unique bronze badge, a real symbol of honour and, on acceptance to a fifth MoP, they receive a silver version of the same badge. You too could secure one of these badges and, like other recipients, wear it with pride at photographic events.

Also, there are many valuable prizes given to pictures chosen by our Sponsors from the exhibition. Paper, printers, cameras, and valuable gift vouchers have been presented. What might YOU win this year?

Entry as an Individual - A maximum of 5 prints may be entered, divided amongst the three Categories in any way. The fee for an Individual entry is £15.

Entry by a Club - The Club may collate the work of any number of Photographers, excluding anyone who has entered as an Individual. A maximum of 5 prints per Photographer may be entered, divided amongst the Categories in any way. The fee for a Club entry is £3 per print with a minimum Club Fee of £15.



MASTERS OF PRINT

Club Awards - Club Entrants and Individual Entrants will each accrue points towards their Club score for a chance to win two generous Club Awards, each with a handsome trophy provided by our primary sponsors, Online Paper and CEWE.
