Many long-term SPF Judges and Speakers have retired over the past four years, after having served our Scottish Clubs in either capacity for many years (some over 50!). Some may still be Judging or Lecturing in a limited capacity, but they may not do so for long.

Although a few individuals have volunteered to take on the role of Judge or Speaker in recent years, this has not replaced the number of Judges or Speakers we have lost.


In a few years the issue will be much worse, we need Clubs and Individuals to persuade



7th Masters of Print Exhibition - Scottish Successes

LOOK OUT FOR THE 7TH MASTERS OF PRINT EXHIBITION COMING TO GRACEFIELD GALLERIES, DUMFRIES FROM $30^{\rm TH}$ NOV TO $21^{\rm ST}$ DEC 2024

The 7th Masters of Print Exhibition opened at St Martin in the Bull Ring, Birmingham, and the awards presentation day was held on Saturday 3rd February 2024 to which many successful authors were able to attend. This shows all of the successful Scottish photographers who were able to attend on the day. As only 60 prints from 60 authors are accepted, it is always a very tightly fought event, even more so this year with a much higher entry than last year, 1374 prints from 347 entrants.

The Judges were subject to a last-minute change due to health issues and were Gordon Jenkins (L&CPU), Chris Palmer (CACC) and Rod Wheelans (SPF), who was also the MoP chairman. In addition to the Individual Entry, there was also a Club competition.

Once again Scottish Photographers did extremely well in the 7th Masters of Print. Of the final 60 works exhibited 11 were from Scottish authors.

Congratulations go to the following successful Scottish authors who gained acceptances – Alan Givens, Anne Greiner, Lorna Hayton, Maybeth Jamieson, Peter Lawrie, Wanda Mackie, Teresa Mitchell, Rikki O'Neill, George Robertson, Keith Thorburn, Martin Watt. One SPF photographer managed to make it 7 Masters of Print out of 7, a great achievement, so well done to Maybeth Jamieson of Dumfries (one of only 3 photographers to do so).

The SPF have again the highest number of prints entered 256, from 14 Club representing 67 photographers.

SPF Clubs also did well in the Club Awards – Kirkcaldy PS finishing 3rd, and Dumfries CC 4th in the new CeWe Diamond Award (Dundee PS 13th, Scottish Circle 17th, CKPS 19th, Ayr PS 21st).

The Scottish Circle finished 3rd in the Online Paper Gold Award, Dumfries CC 4th, Dundee PS 9th, Kirkcaldy PS11th and Ayr PS 17th.

WHY NOT ENTER THE 8TH MoP? - Closes 1st Dec online

Dr David Findlay Clark OBE DL MA PHD c Psycho. FBPsS ARPS BPE2*

Dr David F Clark was a son of the manse, born and educated in Banff before graduating from Aberdeen University. As he progressed, he gained respect not only in his chosen profession but also as an artist and a photographer, Judge and Lecturer. During his lifetime he did his national service in the RAF, then worked as a industrial psychologist in Leicester before joining the NHS as a clinical psychologist in Leicester. In 1966 he returned to Banffshire to take up a consultant post at Ladysbridge Hospital and following a distinguished career eventually retired as director of Grampian Health Board's Area Clinical Psychology Service and was honoured for his service with the award of an OBE in 1989. Such was the respect and esteem he held within his profession he was appointed chair of the clinical division of the British Psychology Society. In 1992 he became deputy Lord Lieutenant of Banffshire and served in many other capacities including Councillor, Hon Sheriff, member of the Children's Panel and Safeguarder to the Scottish Justice system, he was also a consultant for the W.H.O. in Sri Lanka and lectured in USA, India and Canada on his research.

Despite a busy professional life, he found time to be involved in local activities including role as President of Banff Arts Club, a member of the heritage society, documenter of Banff's community and local history, writing multiple books. A stalwart member of Deveron Camera Club he was a respected and admired photographer, past President, Secretary, Judge and Lecturer; David was added to the SPF Roll of Honour in 2003 for his service to photography. David was instrumental in securing the Deveron club funding from National Lottery for updating equipment, however, sadly in recent years failing eyesight and COVID prevented him attending the club. As a judge his often-humorous guidance and advice was always positive and many a budding (and experienced) photographer benefitted from his guidance. David was never afraid to tell a story against himself, such as the time he was walking in the Abernethy area with his beloved wife Janet and two friends when he unexpectedly encountered a capercaillie which he decided to approach to what he though was a safe distance and photograph with a 200mm lens only to find that the bird was attacking him much to the amusement of his companions, the assaults by the bird were ferocious and he struggled to escape its attention; the attack only ceasing when the Caper turned its attention to his companions. He said it may have been a protected species, but I was in more need of protection than the bird.

David's wife and soulmate, the remarkable Janet, to whom he was married for 68 years, predeceased him by nine months and she was deeply missed by David. We extend our sympathy to a remarkable man, he will be missed by his daughters, grandchildren and great grandchildren whom he loved deeply as well as those who were lucky enough to know him. His contribution to his profession and pastimes will ensure he will not be forgotten and I for one will always smile when I think of him; such was the quality of the man.

David was known the length and breadth of Scotland for his photography, and his service to SPF clubs over many years. And in addition to his many visits to Clubs, he was also a frequent exhibition Judge and wrote several articles on Judging for the SPF Bulletin. I had the pleasure, or should I say trepidation, of Judging my first International Salon in around 2001/2 with David and the late Bill McCance, a formidable duo whose reputation preceded them! That was the Bon-a-Slide, run by Bon Accord CC. David passed away in 2023. Sadly, we have been unable to come up with a picture of him, or indeed any of his photographic material. But for those of you who knew David, we hope the above reminds you of him and his work.

PAGB Awards for Photographic Merit Presentation SPF Event being held on Zoom Monday 4th Nov, 7pm

This event suits individuals whether they are just thinking about possibly applying or if they have already applied for a forthcoming adjudication. This PAGB Presentation includes looking at the process itself as well as a selection of images in the passing range at each level together with information of use for all of the levels.

We will also illustrate the differences in quality and requirements between the C, D and M using examples of the same subject at all three levels and talk more about the two newer levels BPAGB and EPAGB. Presented by Rod Wheelans, Chairman of the PAGB APMs & Libby Smith, SPF Awards Officer.

The SPF still produces listings of all of their SPF Judges and Lecturers, in its SPF Directory-Handbook, as a PDF supplied by email link. An updated copy of this will be supplied very soon to Club Committee Main Contacts and 2nd Contacts listed with us. These Contacts will also shortly be able to log into our Admin Area at any time to access a copy.

Although the PAGB no longer supplies a printed PAGB Handbook please note the details it contained are still all available to you. The Judges and Lecturers contained in it, from all of the PAGB Federations, including the SPF, have transferred to an online list held on the PAGB CMS website, details of which are given below. This can be accessible by any SPF Member Club Committee Members who register. The SPF have given guidance below of how to gain access.

What does the PAGB CMS contain? – Lists and details of Judges and Lecturers from all of the 15 Federations throughout the UK, called the Speaker's List. Many are willing to do a 'virtual' presentation or Judging. All of our SPF Judges and Lecturers are listed.

It also contains the PAGB Recorded Lecture Service where you can download Lectures, many of which have commentary as MP4 files. It is the same website as you would complete PAGB Competition Entries and view Results or Digital Catalogues of past competitions. You can purchase tickets etc. for upcoming events.
