## **SPF Annual Portfolio RESULTS 2025**



Best Colour Print - Buzzard Plucking Pheasant by Ian Mitchell, Bon Accord CC

This event was run as three sections Mono Print, Colour Print and Projected Digital Image. A total of 1591 Prints and Projected Images were received from 32 Clubs; made up of 766 PDI, 493 Colour Prints and 331 Mono Prints. This was just over 100 images and prints less than in 2024, but still up on our 2019 total.

The 2025 SPF Annual Portfolio Judging took place on 26<sup>th</sup> July.

The Judges for this event were Steve Proctor MPAGB BPE5 PPSA (L&CPU), James Hardy CPAGB LRPS AFIAP HonLCPU (L&CPU) and Jeremy Malley-Smith DPAGB LRPS EFIAP BPE3\* (NCPF) who all travelled to the Judging venue at Holywood in Dumfriesshire.

All sections were scored out of a maximum of 15, and minimum of 6. The Judges then selected their Individual Awards from the higher scoring photos in each section.

If this form is not received by 20th Oct, we cannot guarantee you will receive a copy in time for your club viewing.

Participating clubs will have <u>no</u> viewing fee to pay provided they have booked a copy **by the 20th October deadline**, \*\*after that time a booking fee will be payable as indicated below for non-participating Clubs. \*Clubs who have not entered the 2025 Portfolio Competitions will have a viewing fee of £10 to pay. 

### Dr Donald Stewart FRPS (1942 – 2025)



Donald Stewart was an active and popular lecturer and judge for camera clubs in the Scottish Photographic Federation for over 30 years. He was awarded honorary membership of Dundee Photographic Society in recognition of his contribution to photography in Scotland.

He joined the Royal Photographic Society in 1992 and acted as Area Organiser for Fife in the Scottish Region for over 20 years. In 2009 he was elected to the Society's Advisory Board, serving for 4 years before stepping down to concentrate on his involvement with the Society's Historical Group. He was Secretary, Deputy Chair and Chair of the Historical Group and also chaired the Editorial Board for the Group's

highly respected journal, the Photo Historian. He organised and promoted events across Great Britain from Wick to London, and organised study visits to Paris, Budapest and the Netherlands. In 2017 he was awarded the Fenton Medal for his outstanding contribution to the work of the RPS.

Donald was dedicated to black and white film photography and favoured large format cameras, printing all his work in his own dark room. He was interested in experimenting with alternative processes. He eventually and somewhat reluctantly converted to digital but never lost his love of a fine silver print. He was awarded his LRPS in 1992; Research ARPS in 1994, ARPS in Pictorial in 1998 and Fellowship in 2011. His Fellowship panel was based on a long-term project to photograph Scotland's WW2 coastal defences.


Donald always tried to enthuse others with his love of photography and, as a Rotarian, organised a Young Photographer competition for Rotary District 1010 for many years, calling on SPF friends to act as judges.

He will be missed by the photographic community in Scotland and beyond.

Another stalwart of Scottish Photography lost in the past few months; It was while Dundee PS hosted the running of the Scottish International Salon in 1996 that I first met Donald. He had the unenviable task of receiving all of the Salon entries, as well as answering questions from the entrants, and was very kind to someone new to entering competitions at that time. Later conversations allowed us to share our love of monochrome darkroom printing and techniques. Donald only stepped down as an SPF Judge and Lecturer very recently, he will be missed by many throughout the SPF.
