

SPF DIGITAL CHAMPIONSHIP 2025

The SPF Digital Championship 2025 was once again run as two separate competitions, The Bowie Trophy and The Plate Trophy. 36 Clubs competed, two more than last year. The Judging took place on Sunday 16th November at Victoria Hall, Dunblane, in front of a large audience. Our Judges were Nick Hilton (L&CPU), Jack Bamford (NCPF) and Dave Butler (L&CPU), who did a tremendous job, and had no less than 32 15's from which to select the Individual Awards.

The event format was the same as last year where all Clubs pre-selected a First Round entry, which was Judged in the morning. Over lunchtime Clubs selected their Final Round from their pre-submitted Bank of Images. These were judged, and their total score was made up from the total of the morning and afternoon rounds added together but with the two lowest scores from the morning dropped.







THE 1ST WINNER OF THE NEW 'HUNTER KENNEDY LANDSCAPE AWARD'

Below Left: is the 'Hunter Kennedy Landscape Award', a lovely piece of Scandinavian glass by Maleras, which sits on a beautifully turned wooden plinth. This Award was donated by Hunter's widow Dena, as a lasting legacy marking his long involvement in Scottish Photography. A tree seems very appropriate as they featured heavily in Hunter's own landscape photography.

Hunter's interest in Club photography spanned over 45 years. He joined Carluke Camera Club in 1977, 3 months after its inception. He served on their committee in almost every senior post including 6 years as President, and laterally as External Competition Secretary, during one of the Club's most successful times in its history, in SPF and PAGB competitions.



He was a member of the Scottish Photographic Federation Executive Committee for 10 years but helped behind the scenes at SPF events and the Scottish Salon for much longer. Hunter held the post of SPF President between 2016 and 2018, and the post of SPF Judge's Liaison Officer from 2017. He also served as an Adviser at the SPF's APM Workshops in Scotland and as a respected member of the PAGB Online APM Advisory service.

He was a very popular SPF Judge and Lecturer for many years and a PAGB Judge from 2016 and he enjoyed lecturing throughout the UK. Over the years he judged several International Exhibitions as well as been an Assessor for several APM Awards Adjudications.

Although he was particularly well known as a landscape photographer, especially his soft, atmospheric Scottish landscapes, he also enjoyed observing people and took pleasure in Candid photography, whether street, festival, travel or sports, which allowed him to combine his love of photography with that of visiting highland games and annual pipe band competitions, or while on holiday.

Optional distinction badges are available to purchase for a modest fee, with all proceeds supporting the ongoing development and operation of the salons.

AWARDS FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC MERIT

The next Adjudication will be held on Saturday 25 and Sunday 26 April 2026, hosted by the NCPF in the Caldew School, Dalston - just outside Carlisle. This is a great time to visit the Lake District but bring your wellies. Whilst it may feel like there is plenty of time I have to report that this Adjudication is already more than 50% booked, so please don't delay.



If you need an extra incentive to apply early, you should know that the fee for entry will increase from 1 January 2026 from £7.50 to £8 per image submitted.



The Adjudicators for this event are **Gordon Jenkins** L&CPU, **Adrian Lines** L&CPU, **Tillman Kleinhans** L&CPU, **Leigh Preston** MCPF, **Libby Smith** SPF and **Richard Speirs** NCPF.

NEW Aug 2025 What is Allowed or Not Allowed when entering SPF Competitions and Al Guidance

A reminder that entries made into all of our SPF Competitions must now comply fully with the 'ethos' contained within this guidance document, and this compliance now appears as a 'Rule' within our competitions (from June 2023). Furthermore, if the SPF is in any doubt of the eligibility of an entry, they may request RAW files or jpegs (incl. neighbouring jpegs).

This document has been updated due to questions received over recent months from Clubs or individuals. We have added additional clarifications to our earlier document and updated our 'What Is and Isn't Allowed and SPF Competitions' document (marked **Aug 2025 Issue 5**) available from the below link, or from the Competition Guidance page of our website.

It has come to our notice that some people are mistakenly quoting that "The SPF don't allow photos created using 'AI' within their SPF Competitions". Strictly speaking this statement is incorrect. There are no restrictions on using software that is called 'AI' such as Photoshop or Lightroom we have all been using these programs and 'AI' tools for years within previous versions of Photoshop etc. This is because AI (or AI Assisted) uses existing image content only when processing the image.

The SPF do however wish to ensure that all parts of the finished photograph have been taken by the author. We therefore do not allow those 'AI' features that 'Generate' content using other people's imagery or text prompts. This is because AI Generate (or Generative AI) has human-like intelligence, and imports new content into the image, so some or all of the pixels in the image will no longer have been taken by the author.

Key features in Photoshop or Lightroom to avoid that 'generate' content include - Generate Image', Generative Fill', 'Generative Expand', 'Generative Remove', and Text Prompts or Effects. There isn't an overall switch to disable all 'AI Generate' features in Lightroom or Photoshop, it is handled on a tool-by-tool basis as in the following example.

This does not mean that a tool such as the Remove tool cannot be used. In both Lightroom and Photoshop, the remove tool has an option to untick 'Generative AI' or turn off 'Generative AI' in Photoshop (on the options bar). If 'Generative AI' is turned off, the tool still uses the advantages of the new AI Firefly, but it uses it as a Content-Aware removal tool, meaning it is using the information from the photographer's own picture to replace the area, not imagery from other people's photographs, so no infringement of our rules.

The document also has links to relevant web areas you may find of use and explains more about AI Generator Software. The PAGB's position is also given at the end of the August 2025 version of this SPF guidance document 'What Is and Isn't Allowed and SPF Competitions'.

It is appreciated that the individual photographer may not be fully aware of exactly how individual processing functions act, whether in-camera or in post-processing. However, photographers should be aware of when any significant addition has been made to their image which is not part of their original.

The SPF's advice is to try your best to enter images that comply with the 'ethos' or 'spirit' of this document, and the PAGB's 'Only You Can Know' document.

The examples given may also help but they are not meant to be definitive, merely a guide, and should be read in conjunction with the PAGB's 'ONLY YOU CAN KNOW' document supplied at Page 5 or from the following link





FIAP DISTINCTIONS 2026 CHANGES AND APPLYING

The SPF is only permitted to submit applications to FIAP once a year, and our timetable for applications is different from that of the PAGB, SPF Applications open 1st March and close 15th May, with submission to FIAP made in June to maintain an August certificate date.

We require our own SPF forms, in addition to FIAP, so please wait for those and an update to the Notes for Applicants to appear dated 2026 before submitting.

A new Excel form for 2026 is now available, more details below.

I have previously notified via the SPF website and by email that there are major changes to the FIAP Distinctions Rules for AFIAP, EFIAP, EFIAP/levels etc.. applications from 1st January 2026. A number of New Distinctions are being added quite separate to the current Distinctions in the form of Portfolios.

Full details on all of the above FIAP Distinctions are available in the 'Official NEW FIAP Distinctions Document 047-2025' for 2026, available under the 'FIAP Distinctions Next Applications (2026)' heading from our dedicated SPF webpage —




