- 1. President's Opening Remarks Gordon welcomed everyone. He also reminded those attending that only registered affiliated society delegates may vote. There was comment of some individuals being unable to attend because they didn't have the zoom link. Libby explained that the initial email where people confirmed attendance had made clear that the zoom link would be sent on the Friday prior to this meeting, and anyone who didn't receive that email should contact the General Secretary in advance of this meeting to have it resent.

 3. Minutes of the 2023 AGM As supplied in the Annual Report supplied with the notice of this meeting and again with the zoom link. There were no amendments and acceptance of the Minutes was proposed by Ken Goodfellow, seconded Cathy Davies.
- 4. Matters arising from the 2023 Minutes there were no matters arising.
- 5. Treasurer's Report on 2023 (pages 21 26 of pre-supplied Annual Report) Treasurer, Libby highlighted aspects of the Treasurer's Report. Her report last year pointed out the concern for the drop in Clubs rejoining which again continued to be a trend at the start of 2023 when we saw our Club numbers drop to 81, and a membership of 2719, well down on the 3453 pre-covid number and 86 Clubs. However, as I write this report I am pleased to report that we have had an upturn in the number of Clubs with 5 joining us throughout the year, and a total individual members of 2812.

This Annual Report for end of 2023 shows a surplus on year of £2438.75. Of note is the lack of an audience Print Championship, and a smaller than normal entry into the Portfolios. However, the Balance Sheet doesn't show our true end of year balance as two of our three events ran over to 2024, for Income or expenses. Therefore, it is important to note the 2024 current position at the end of two events completed. We have a surplus of £2,455 on the year so far. This also includes most of our catching up of expenses, and Medals split between 2022 and 2023 with only trophy engraving to come.

As noted 2023 was not a typical year given our Print Championship ran as a non-audience event, giving a large deficit on the event, entry being down for the Portfolios but the Digital Championship as our first audience event was very successful with more Clubs entering our new format than our old pre-covid one. It was also heartening to see such a good size of audience. The SPF Executive Meetings have returned to being held in person when we require to collect or return prints, and running the rest of the time via zoom, in order to keep travelling expenses costs down.

Of note when considering this year's combined SPF/PAGB Subscription Rate is that the PAGB once again increased their rate for the coming year by £3 per Club to £39.00, this currently

equates to 10p per member. Our current combined SPF/PAGB rate is £4.00 per member. Given the situation in many clubs where Club membership is still depleted making the impact of increased costs of travel/venue/accommodation/insurance being incurred even greater. It is difficult to know what impact any increases we may make, will affect the loss of more Clubs at our SPF renewal.

I am therefore of a mind to keep any increase to a minimum and try to hold on to the smaller Clubs we still have while minimise the risk of a deficit. Since 2020 we have been prepared for an annual loss of £2000 to £3000, which so far hasn't happened. We are starting to have many more enquiries from non-member clubs about joining. I would hope by keeping the subscription rate lower, that we may get more of those to join us, thus avoiding the requirement for larger increases longer term for Clubs who remain with us.

Taking all of this into account the SPF Executive Committee therefore proposes to increase the subscriptions rate for 2025 only by the minimum required to cover the PAGB's £3 subscription increase, therefore 10p per member to £4.10 per member payable by 31st December 2024. We think this is the best way forward to maintain as many member Clubs as possible.

Although not an AGM proposal we would also draw your attention to the changes made to the SPF Membership Declaration Form for 2025 following the PAGB reinstating the pre-covid Definition of a Club i.e. requirement of being a Member Clubs. The additional latitudes given during the covid period, for Clubs not having to meet in person, have now been removed. For the avoidance of doubt, this does not mean that Member Clubs cannot have 'virtual' meetings, but they must also meet the minimum requirements of meeting in-person in a physical location, to be in line with our SPF Constitution and that of the PAGB. Full details were supplied within the Annual Report.

Isobel Lindsay, Edinburgh asked if she could also broadcast these 12 in-person meetings e.g. 25 attendees in the room, and 25 online. It was agreed, yes, that was fine. Libby did add that there were requirements for individuals to attend in-person to be eligible to enter PAGB competitions. She would send details.

- 6. Proposals Subscription Proposals for 2025 (page 27 of the pre-supplied Annual Report) The SPF EC propose that the joint SPF/PAGB per member subscription rate for 2025 be increased to £4.10 per member (was £4.00 in 2024) payable by 31st Dec 2024. We propose that the cap for large clubs remains at 120, and no levy for late payments. Proposals seconded by Cathy. Carried unanimously.
- 7. Annual Reports President, Gordon Mcmann announced that the following items were contained in this year's Report and have been distributed to all clubs prior to the AGM. Only matters arising from these or on this Agenda will be discussed. (pages 9 to 20 & 28)
- 7.2 General Secretary extract Neil noted that we ended 2020 with 97 member Clubs, but struggles with reduced memberships, venue shortages and price increases, meant that by the end of 2022 Club numbers had dropped to 84. This trend was to continue throughout 2023 and into early 2024, with a drop to 81, with Carnoustie CC folding, and Deveron CC, The Levern CC and Visions PC not rejoining. However, on a more positive note, we saw Orkney CC rejoin us for the start of 2024, and throughout the year Deveron CC and Isleburgh PC also rejoined, along with new Clubs Alba PS, Scone 50+ PG and Clyde CC.

For 2023, we planned to hold all of our SPF events with an audience. Unfortunately we fell at the first hurdle when we found our previous venue of Stirling Court Hotel outwith our budget as they had decided to charge a per delegate rate of £35 to all hirers rather than a room only cost, irrespective of the size of audience. Despite our best efforts we were unable to find a replacement venue to hold an audience event so were forced to run without one in late April at the New Lanark Hotel, with only Judges and SPF workers in attendance. It was heartening to note however that there was a good print entry when a number of Federations were reporting a significant fall in prints. We were also very pleased to get support from Paper Spectrum, who had been prepared to once again have a stand at our event if we had been able to run with an audience. They still supported the event however and awarded a sponsor's award.

Since our last AGM we have again lost some more stalwarts of Scottish Photography, they have included Dr David Clark a long term member and past President and Secretary of Banff Art Club, later called Deveron CC. David was also a very well know SPF Judge and Lecturer.

Neil Barlow of Cowal CC, for many years on their committee, including many as Secretary or President, known to all who visited. He was also well known for Judging and Lecturing. Brian Clark, a long term member and committee member of Dundee PS, including as President. He featured regularly in the SPF's awards lists over the years. And, most recently on the 5th Sept Clive D Turner, who was a long term member of Paisley PS, as well as being an SPF and PAGB Judge and Lecturer for many years. He also served on our SPF Executive until 2019. He held many posts over a number of years including President (1991-93) General Secretary, Salon Chairman, FIAP Liaison Officer as well as running Portrait Workshops, being a Judges Assessor for many years and running the SPF Slide Championship, the forerunner to our Digital Championship which some may remember attending at Perth or Lochgelly. He was added to the SPF Roll of Honour in our Centenary year for his service to photography, and was awarded an APAGB by the PAGB that same year (2003). And, since the Annual Report was written Sandy Cleland, a member of Edinburgh PS, and the SPF Roll of Honour passed away on 12th Oct. The online zoom register set up by Adrian Lines on Facebook proved so popular during Covid,

The online zoom register set up by Adrian Lines on Facebook proved so popular during Covid, that it was replaced by an online PAGB system called the 'CMS' website, which also replaces the 'printed' PAGB Handbook. This online system gives all Clubs up to date access to all of the Judges and Lecturers from throughout the Federations of the PAGB, including the SPF, for both zoom and in-person bookings. To gain access Club Officers require to create an individual CMS log-in and then have a Club Officer account registration approved. More details are available from the SPF website as to how to access this area.

We are running a campaign to make everyone aware of the need to act now. I urge you to visit the SPF website homepage where you will find the article 'Does Your Club Need Judges or Speakers?'

 $7.3\,$ PAGB Inter-Fed $\,$ John noted that for 2023 these competitions were again open to prints only in three sections Colour, Mono and Nature. The full results were to see the SPF finish 5th in the Colour Print Sec Θ on, 9th in the Nature and and an excellent 2nd in the Mono Print Section.

7.4 SPF Portfolios – John noted that for these competitions went ahead in the pre-covid format Colour Print, Mono Print and Projected Digital. The print sections being Judged as prints, and not as digital copies as we had done during covid. There was a total of 1047 prints and PDIs received from 27 clubs. Print entries were down on what we would expect, but still a good entry as clubs get back to normal. Best Mono Club was Carluke; Best Colour Club was Dumfres; Best Digital Club was jointly won by Carluke, Dumfries, Kirkcaldy and Paisley Colour. 7.5 SPF Print Championship – Libby noted that this had been run as a non-audience event as the SPF had been unable to find a suitable affordable venue. The judging was still held in person and saw Dumfries CC as overall winners as well as Best Colour Club, and Best Mono Club. Paper Spectrum supported us by giving a prize of paper and mount board for the event. 7.6 SPF DIGITAL CHAMPIONSHIP – This was our first audience event post-covid, at our new venue at Dunblane. We were all getting to grips with a new venue, and SPF and Clubs with new forms and processing. The event didn't quite go smoothly, and overran considerably, however we tweaked the process for 2024 following comments and how the day went. Bowie Trophy winners were Kilmaurs PC. Plate Trophy winners were Livingston CC.

7.7 PAGB AWARDS — We had a number of successes in 2023 and in 2024. At the end of 2023 we ran workshops with an aim of getting people interested in the awards when we host the PAGB Adjudication in April 2025. We were too overly successful as most who attended the workshop have already been successful so we are running more workshops to encourage others to go for April 2025. We are running a FREE zoom presentation event on Monday 4th at 7pm which is open to any Club member to attend. This will cover the process of the PAGB Awards and give examples of all of the different levels. Just contact Libby for the link if you're not on her PAGB Awards mailing list. Mark Woodfin, Mearns asked if the link sent to Clubs would work if forwarded on to members. Libby said yes it should, or supply the Meeting ID and Passcode. Sandra Taylor, Livingston; as Monday is our Club night are you going to record the meeting. Libby replied, no, it has been proven that the recording doesn't come across well. If it proves popular we will do another one on a different night.

7.8 PAGB REPORT – Libby highlighted the forthcoming Masters of Print deadline and

encouraged all to enter. The SPF have a track record of being the best Federation, and our Scottish entrants have done very well not just being successful in the Exhibition but also with winning Sponsor's prizes.

- 7.8 FIAP LIAISON OFFICER REPORT Libby noted a change to the Scottish annual closing date for applications. They now require to submitted to the SPF between 1st March and 15th May
- 8. ELECTION OF OFFICE BEARERS & ORDINARY MEMBERS It is customary at this point for a sitting President to step down. This is Gordon's second year so the President elect George Taylor thanked Gordon for his service on behalf of the SPF Executive. He said that it had been a learning experience for all of the executive members as we transitioned into our new venue, and the challenges we faced was all part fo Gordon's tenure in office.

Libby Smith took the chair and formally proposed George Taylor Snr Vice President be elected as President in line with the SPF Consititution. Seconded Eddie Telford. With no one against that was carried and George took the chair. Full details for the remaining posts were as follows below -

9. Any Other Competent Business - Rod wished to add his thoughts on Clive Turner. Rod returned to Scotland in the late 80's and Clive was the 1st photographic friend he made, after joining Glasgow Telecom Club. Clive went to the GDPU to get involved, I went to the SPF, and in a very short space of time we were both very important in these orgainsations. I became the SPF President in '91 and recruited Clive as my SPF Vice President . Together we brought the SPF into the the 20th century. It didn't do too much prior to then. We introduced the charge per member rather than per club. Clive did an amazing amount to change the nature of what the SPF did. And, he went on for many decades after that in all sorts of roles.

Mark Woodfin, Mearns - Can the committee consider larger print sizes for Panorama format, even if as two panels. Libby responded that it wouldn't be practical for us to capture larger prints for viewing on the day, and it wouldn't fit the area of illumination on our lightboxes. Larger than 500mm risks the prints being damaged during transportation and handling with piles of prints. We couldn't handle or transport a bigger print box as we struggle to transport all that we require at the moment. We can look at whether or not it would be practical for our Digital competitions.

George thanked all for attending and closed the AGM.

I also attended the Highland Challenge hosted by Inverness Camera Club. Clubs from the Highland region, Orkney and Shetland participated and we viewed some superb examples of work.

We all enjoy the meetings and of course the events and we get a sense of pride when we have another successful event. So please let us know if you are willing to work as part of the SPF team.

I should also take time to mention one or two people who have contributed to the SPF. Firstly I would like to take the opportunity to remember the late Jim Pollock, a great character, keen photographer and gardener and a long time member of the SPF and Carluke Camera Club who worked cheerfully in the backroom. I had the privilege of spending a lot of time with Jim and he was a great help to me and I miss him in the backroom. I would also like to acknowledge the contribution of John McVie, past President, Competition Secretary and man of many talents. He is standing down after many years of service and I would like on behalf of the executive and membership to thank him for his hard work and commitment to the SPF - he has helped many an event whether open, or in camera, to be a great success and he will be missed. Thank you John, for your commitment over many years it is appreciated and we will hopefully see you at events in future. In closing I would also like to thank the SPF team for their hard work they undertake to ensure events run smoothly.

GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

For 2024, we finaly managed to hold our two championships with an audience. Victoria Hall, Dunblane, has proved to be an ideal venue, now that we've gotten to grips with the heating! And, it has proved invaluable in us being able to keep our venue and event costs manageable.

In addition to our own SPF events, externally, Scottish authors and Clubs continue to do very well in the PAGB and International arenas some details of which has been covered within the various reports within this Annual Report

A trend of losing SPF Member Clubs was to continue from 2023 into early 2024, with Carnoustie CC folding, and Deveron CC, The Levern CC and Visions PC not rejoining. Gradually we saw a turn in fortunes as some Clubs secured new venues or members, and one or two new Clubs were formed. We saw Orkney CC rejoin us for the start of 2024, and throughout the year Deveron CC and Isleburgh PC also rejoined, along with new Clubs Alba PS, Scone 50+ PG and Clyde CC. Clydesdale CC sadly folded in late 2024, and for 2025 Irvine CC deciding not to rejoin us, but Hamilton CC, and newly formed Cullen CC and West Fife CC joining throughout 2025, to give us 87 Clubs to date.

The Edinburgh International Print Exhibition ran again in 2024 and again in 2025, with the 4th Edinburgh Digital just about to close as I write this report.

During 2025, we co-opted Margaret Lothian from Mid Calder CC on to our SPF Executive after she answered our plea for assistance at one of our Championships. She has already helped many of our FIAP Distinctions applicants this year.

Sadly, John McVie, Dumfries, a Past SPF President and long term SPF Portfolio Secretary and PAGB Inter-Fed Competitions Secretary has decided that this AGM is the time to retire from the SPF Executive. John has been a tireless worker at almost every SPF event for main years, as well as many other events run by the PAGB. We owe John a huge dept of gratitude for all he has done for Club photography over the years.

We have again lost some more stalwarts of Scottish Photography, they have included Sandy Cleland, just at the time of last year's AGM, a member of Edinburgh PS, and the SPF Roll of Honour, and a long-term SPF Judge and Lecturer. Over the summer we lost another longstanding SPF Judge and Speaker of over 30 years, Dr Donald Stewart who was an honorary member of Dundee PS.

Although our SPF Directory-Handbook and the PAGB CMS website are available for Clubs to access for Judges and Lecturers, we require to act if we are going to continue to have Judge and Speakers available to visit our Clubs in the coming years. Many of our long term Judges and Lecturers are now beginning to retire from our lists, quicker than we can bring new people on. We need everyone's help in encouraging more people to volunteer to take on these roles if all Clubs are to continue to have Judges and Lecturers available to them. We therefore urge all SPF Clubs, Judges and Lecturers to have a word with anyone you think might be able or willing to take on one of these roles.

We are continuing to run our campaign to make everyone aware of the need to act now. I urge you to visit the SPF website homepage where you will find the article 'Does Your Club Need Judges or Speakers?'

Thank you to all of the SPF Club contacts we have dealt with over the past year. All of our organisations rely on their volunteers, and sadly volunteers are always undervalued, so if you can help in any way keep your Club running why not consider volunteering for your committee. I'm sure they could do with the help, and it may just save the future of your Club!

PAGB INTER-FED COMPETITIONS

In 2024 the PAGB Inter-Federation Competition Judging was open again to Prints only with three sections being judged - Colour, Mono and Nature where up to 30 prints per section could be submitted by each Federation, with the top scoring 15 counting to the overall Federation placing. The SPF made up this year's entry by making a selection from prints entered into this year's SPF Print Championship, and we are very grateful to the Clubs and Individual Photographers who gave us their work to use from the Championship, together with those who gave us additional prints if our selected print wasn't available. SPF PRINT & PDI ANNUAL PORTFOLIOS

The 2024 SPF Annual Portfolios went ahead in their format of three sections - a Colour Print section, Mono Print section and a Projected Digital Section.

The competitions were judged on the 10th August in Holywood Hall near Dumfries by Keith Snell (NCPF), John Tillotson (NCPF) and Stephen Fowler (NCPF).

A total of 1700 Prints and Projected Images were received; made up of 771 PDI, 552 Colour Print PDIs and 377 Mono Prints PDIs. There were an increased number of print entries this year. SPF CLUB PRINT CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2024 Print Championship Judging took place on Sunday 18th February 2024 at Victoria Hall, Dunblane in front of a good sized audience. The Judges for the event were Leigh Preston MPAGB EFIAP FIPF APAGB from Gloucester (MCPF), Gary Langley DPAGB from Nottingham (N&EMPF) and Nick Hilton EFIAP DPAGB BPE5 from South Ribble (L&CPU).

Some 1325 prints had been entered from 33 Clubs, just 50 prints less than in 2020, which is excellent news given that many Clubs had seen a reduction in prints due to the pandemic. It was heartening also to see several Clubs new to the event participating.

While the prints were being Judged they were photographed and simultaneously projected onto a big 8' screen to improve the audience viewing. Once again the scoring was the normal range of each Judge scoring a Max of 5; Min 2 to achieve a Maximum of 15; minimum of 6. These scores were then used to calculate the Club Results. The Individual Awards selected by our three Judges came from the prints scoring 14 or 15 from the Mono and Colour sections. All Individual and Club Results were announced at the Judging. A gallery of all of the Individual Awards for this year is shown on an SPF web gallery.

PAGB REPORT

PAGB 94th AGM ran on it's usual April timetable and was held as a physical meeting with PAGB EC and attendees in Smethwick Clubrooms on 13th April 2024. Others were able to stream the AGM but were unable to contribute. All voting was done in advance. The event was not well attended by anyone other than the PAGB EC.

The elections of OB's saw the re-election of President as Daphne Hanson (EAF); Vice President David Gibbins (N&EMPF); Adrian Lines (LCPU) Honorary Secretary and Peter Young (WPF) as Treasurer.

SUBSCRIPTIONS: AGM 2024: With the return to normal, and increased costs of running inperson events this had generated the proposed rate of £39.00 per club for 2025, an increase of £3.00 pr Club on the 2024 amount. This was agreed unanimously

The Executive Committee held all meetings in person during 2024, in Feb, April and October all were held in facilities at Warwick University campus.

RECORDED LECTURE SERVICE with instant download proved extremely popular again in 2024, with new lectures continuing to be added. This service is available to all SPF Clubs (see SPF website for details of how to access this).

INSURANCE: Insurances were provided for 2024 via PAGB broker, Hive Insurance Services had made an arrangement with the PAGB, with underwriters AXA. PLI insurance, and MLI were arranged at very competetive prices, however it transpired that All Risks was somewhat more expensive. But, Hive Insurance Services have reviewed this with the insurer, and also set up a new website giving more flexibility for amounts insured, to keep costs as low as possible for Clubs.

GB CUP & TROPHY 2024: The PAGB GB Cup and Trophy were Judged at end of January 2024 in Smethwick Clubrooms. We had two Scottish Judges on the panel, Rod Wheelans and Neil Smith, who was joined by David Smith from Surrey PA.

The results were as follows -

GB Cup Open – Top SPF clubs were Dumfries CC 4th 158, Kirkcaldy PS 5th= 157 and Paisley Colour PC and Edinburgh PS tied in 25th= 147. Best Overall Image went to Car Parts, Tbilisi by Anne Greiner, Dumfries CC. An HC went to Duo at the Door by Eion Johnston, Edinburgh PS.

GB Cup Nature – No SPF Clubs in top 20; PCPC, Dumfries and Edinburgh tied in 21st= 146 and Bon Accord was 27th= 145. HC's were awared to Sea Gooseberry by Moira Gardener, Kirkcaldy PS and Landing Gear Down by Jim Biscoe, Dingwall CC.

GB Cup LE – only 10 clubs entered – CKPS was 6th= 125. There were no individual awards in this section.

GB Trophy Open (print) – 21 Clubs entered. Top SPF Club was 3rd= Dumfries CC 165, next was CKPS in 13th=. HC went to Car Parts, Tbilisi by Anne Greiner, Dumfries.

GB Trophy Nature (print) – 16 Clubs entered. Only one SPF Club entered and finished 16th CKPS (Not a complete entry). There were no Individual Awards.

INTER-CLUB PDI CHAMPIONSHIP 2024 event was held at a new venue in Warwick Myton School on 21st July. Three Scottish Clubs made the trip to represent the SPF; Dumfries CC who made last year's final, along with Bon Accord CC and Kilmaurs PC who qualified in November's SPF PDI Championship.

This year's Judges were Tillman Kleinhans (L&CPU), Libby Smith (SPF) and Howard Tate (YPU). The 37 Clubs entered this year's competition, from the PAGB Federations, and competed in the first and second rounds for a place in the final. The competition was keenly fought with 10 Clubs qualifying for the final.

PAGB REPORT

At the end of the first two rounds, Dumfries had qualified for the Final, while Bon Accord CC and Kilmaurs PC competed for the Plate trophy. The final results was to see Dumfries finish in 8th place with 244 points. In the plate Kilmaurs finished on 94 points, and Bon Accord CC finished on 99 points in 8th= place. No Individual Awards went to Scottish authors this time.

INTER-CLUB PRINT CHAMPIONSHIP 2024 event was held again at Westholme School, Blackburn on Saturday 19th October. Two Scottish Clubs made the trip to represent the SPF; Carluke CC and Edinburgh PS.

The Judges were Ray Brammall (YPU), Helen Hanafin (IPF) and Richard Speirs (NCPF). 37 Clubs competed in the first round for a place in the final. Nine Clubs ended up qualifying for the final, which was again a close fought battle with only one point between making it into the Final and the Plate competition. Unfortunately no SPF clubs made it into the final.

The Plate result was to see Edinburgh finishing 11th= on 103 pts and Carluke finishing 5th on 106 pts, with the Plate winners finishing on 113 pts. One Individual Award went to a Scottish author, The Sweep by Robert Hendry of Carluke CC was awarded a Siver Medal for a Judge's Choice.

MASTERS OF PRINT: The 8th Masters of Print closed for entries on 1st Dec 2024, and once again Scottish authors did extremely well. The event was Judged in early December and followed by an Exhibition back at Birmingham in St Martin's Church in the Bullring with the opening and awards presentation day being held on Saturday 8th Feb 2025 to which many successful authors were able to attend. Sponsors again presented their own prizes to their chosen prints.

The Judges were Sue O'Connell (WCPF), Tillman Kleinhans (L&CPU) and Michael O'Sullivan (IPF) As only 60 prints from 60 authors are accepted, it is always a very tightly fought event, with 853 prints from 192 entrants. In addition to the Individual Entry, there was also a Club competition. Once again Scottish Photographers did extremely well in the 8th Masters of Print. Of the final 60 works exhibited 11 were from Scottish authors.

Congratulations go to the following successful Scottish authors who gained acceptances — Michele Campbell, Brian Cathie, Margaret Elliot, Gaille Gray, Maybeth Jamieson, Ken Lindsay, Ian Mitchell, David Moyes, Rikki O'Neill, Cameron Scott and Keith Thorburn. Keith's photo One-Legged Meadow Pipit was also awarded a PAGB Silver Medal for Michael O'Sullivan's Judge's Choice. One SPF photographer managed to make it 8 Masters of Print out of 8, a great achievement, so well done to Maybeth Jamieson of Dumfries!(one of only 3 photographers to do so).

We, as a Federation, did extremely well coming 2nd with 173 pts to L&CPU's 182 pts. We were represented by 9 Clubs and 41 authors who entered a total of 173 prints. In the Club results Dumfries ended up as top Scottish club in both the Diamond and Gold Club awards, finishing 5th and 3rd respectively. Scottish Circle finished 9th in the Diamond Club and Dundee PS finished 8th in the Gold Club award. Next placed were Edinburgh 12th in the Diamond Club, and Kirkcaldy PS 11th in the Gold Club Award.

APPOINTMENTS: Rod Wheelans (PAGB Hon-Life Vice President) continues as a member of the APAGB, J.S. Lancaster, Judges', Print Championship, and Standards and Governance subcommittees. He is also Chairman of the Awards for Photographic Merit, Masters of Print, and PAGB e-news editor. I was re-elected as the member of the PAGB. I am a member of subcommittees - Print & Digital Championships, GB Cup and GB Trophy, APM's, Masters of Print, Strategy, JS Lancaster and Technical (Competition Management System, CMS).

TREASURER'S COMMENTS ON FINANCIAL STATEMENT

My report last year pointed out the concern for the drop in Clubs rejoining which again continued to be a trend at the start of 2023 when we saw our Club numbers drop to 81, and a membership of 2719, well down on the 3453 pre-covid number and 86 Clubs. However, as the 2024 report was written I was pleased to report an upturn in the number of Clubs with 5 joining us throughout the year, and a total individual members of 2812. This meant that when we renewed PAGB membership for 2025, we were the only Federation not to see a decrease in the number of it's member Clubs, with 86 Clubs and 2826 members.

We did lose North Berwick sadly in April as they struggled to obtain new Officebearers, but Cullen Camera Collective joined us in March, and just recent West Fife Camera Collective have joined us taking us to 87 Clubs.

This Annual Report for end of 2024 shows a small deficit on year of £868.88, however due to an oversight where the PAGB payed a workshop payment into our personal account instead of the SPF's, this was omitted from 2024 and will be shown transferred in 2025. This amount was £881.64 so the year effectively breaks even.

2024 saw our three SPF main events return to normal. Of note for these three main events is that the figures on this Balance Sheet don't show all three events accurately as the balance sheet includes figures for two of these events that ran over from 2023, as reported last year. Additionally the 2024 Digital Championship figures have run over into 2025. All Income/Expenses will appear in the respective year's accounts.

But, to give an accurate picture of the 2024 events all Income/expenses for 2024 events only are included in the surplus/deficit summary given on the following page.

SPF Print Championship Feb 2024 - Was run as an audience in-person event. SPF Annual Portfolios Aug 2024 - Ran as our normal non-audience event with in-person Judging. 2023 entry was down on previous years. For 2024 entry has gone back up again. SPF Digital Championship Nov 2024 - Was run as an audience in-person event. We have maintained holding the SPF Executive Meetings in person when we require to collect or return prints, and running the rest of the time via zoom, in order to keep travelling expenses costs down.

The figures so far for 2025 are better than expected, despite holding a large PAGB Awards 2-day workshops in Jan, and hosting the PAGB Awards Adjudication in April, which incurred additional travel and accommodation costs for the SPF. We will however have a significant Trophy engraving cost to come in the remainder of 2025/2026 as we catch up on the previous 5 years.

We have managed to get our Online Banking partially up and running to accept BACS payments to our main account, and this option will be available for payments going forward. We were also asked by one Club to simplify our Annual Subscription paperwork to reduce duplication of information requiring to be completed by Clubs. This has also been done, and will allow the Clubs to submit the forms by email and pay electronically or by cheque.

Of note when considering this year's combined SPF/PAGB Subscription Rate is that the PAGB once again increased it's rate for the coming year by £2 per Club to £41.00.

Our current combined SPF/PAGB rate is £4.10 per member. Given the situation in many clubs where Club membership is still depleted making the impact of increased costs of travel/venue/accommodation/insurance being incurred even greater. I am therefore of a mind to continue to keep any increase to a minimum, to cover this

PAGB increase only, and try to hold on to the Clubs we still have while minimise the risk of a deficit.

Taking all of this into account the SPF Executive Committee therefore proposes to increase the subscriptions rate for 2026 only by the minimum required to cover the PAGB's £3 subscription increase, therefore 10p per member to £4.20 per member payable by 31st December 2025. We think this is the best way forward to maintain as many member Clubs as possible.

Note on events - The 2024 Balance Sheet only shows Income/Expenses within the 2024 year. The balance sheet includes two events who's Income/Expenses ran over from 2023, and omits some Income/Expenses for the 2024 Digital Championship that ran over into 2025. So, to give an accurate picture of the three 2024 events all Income/expenses for the 2024 events are indicated in the surplus/deficit above, but will appear in the respective year's accounts.

Over the 3 events we had a surplus of £310.86, although Tea/Coffee catering costs are not included in the Expenses against these events. Some one-of costs for Flasks etc are included in the 2024 total, and supplies also covered all meetings and other workshops.

AGM PROPOSALS 2025 SUBSCRIPTIONS PROPOSAL FOR 2026

The 'per member' Annual Subscription proposed by us (the SPF) annually is a joint SPF & PAGB membership fee. Although things are beginning to get back to normal, the SPF and many of our member Clubs are still seeing the effects of Covid, particularly with reduced memberships. We are also aware that costs are going up, and now that we are back holding physical events, we are affected by the same increases as our Clubs.

These increased costs have also affected the PAGB and their AGM have agreed their Subscription for 2026, which shows an increase of £2 per Club to the rate of £41.00 per Club. This has led the SPF to this proposed small Annual Subscription rate for 2026.

As we currently have 86 Clubs this increase equates to a cost of £172 to find (6p per member). Our current rate is £4.00 per member. Given the situation in many clubs where Club membership is still depleted making the impact of increased costs of travel/venue/accommodation/insurance being incurred even greater. It is difficult to know what impact any increases we may make, will affect the loss of more Clubs at our SPF renewal. We are therefore of a mind to keep the increase to a minimum and try to hold on to the smaller Clubs we still have while minimise the risk of a deficit.

We are therefore proposing an increase of 10p per member to cover this PAGB increase only.

The SPF Executive Committee propose that the subscriptions rate for 2026 be increased by 10p to £4.20 per member payable by 31st December 2025.

Although we do not propose a late payment levy for 2026 Clubs should be aware that if their Subscription is not paid by the 1st week in January they may be ineligible for PAGB Services, CMS Website Access to Judges and Lecturers Lists, Competitions and more importantly Insurances as we now require to supply a list of eligible Clubs to the PAGB and Insurance Brokers in early January.

We propose that the Fee threshold for large clubs remains at 120 members

These proposals also require the completition of the SPF Annual Subscription Membership Declaration Form together with Main Club Contact Details etc. to be completed by 31st December.

REMINDER - SPF MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY CHANGE FOR 2025 ON

Please Note that the temporary conditions agreed for Clubs to be able to run 'virtual - only' was removed by the PAGB in 2024, and subsequently the SPF, so that our SPF Member Club's membership complies with that of the PAGB, and subsequently that of their Insurers. Full details are given on the following page.

Please note this does not mean that Clubs cannot hold virtual meetings, only that they must comply with the minimum in-person meeting requirements as well.

Any Club who cannot comply with the details laid out in this updated Membership Declaration Form can apply to the SPF and PAGB direct for membership. They should do so as soon as possible and not wait for the renewal date.

SPF CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

The joint Annual Subscription for 2026 to the SPF (and PAGB) will be at (a rate as agreed at the AGM) per member payable to the 'SPF' by 31st December 2025 (or at time of joining), and on completion and submission of our SPF Annual Subscription and Declaration Form 2026

Please Note that the additional latitudes given during the covid period, for Clubs not having to meet in person, have been removed from this Declaration. For the avoidance of doubt, the below does not mean that Member Clubs cannot have 'virtual' meetings, but they must also meet the minimum requirements of meeting in-person in a physical location, to be in line with our SPF Constitution and that of the PAGB.

Since 2016, it is now a condition of Membership that all Clubs require to complete a Declaration annually, at renewal of membership. This is to show that Clubs fulfil the following requirements outlined in our SPF Constitution and PAGB definitions as follows:

FROM THE SPF CONSTITUTION - "1.2 A Society may be affiliated to the SPF only if it is a camera club, photographic society, photographic club or photographic group with a published constitution and published programme of events, united by a common interest in photography, meeting in person for mutual co-operation, education, entertainment or competition solely from a physical location within Scotland."

THE PHOTOGRAPHIC ALLIANCE OF GREAT BRITAIN DEFINES A CLUB AS: "A camera club, photographic society, photographic club or photographic group with a published constitution and programme of events, united by a common interest in photography, meeting in person for mutual co-operation, education, entertainment or competition solely from one or more physical locations within the Geographical Limits of the PAGB. (Constitution, section 9). The Geographical Limits include The United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands and only Clubs falling within this definition are qualified to enter PAGB Competitions.

Clubs are expected to meet regularly, meaning at least twelve times each year, usually during a prescribed season, and in-person, meaning at an actual physical location with members present - not an online meeting."

"Exceptions: Historically the PAGB has affiliated a number of National and Specialist Clubs. The Federations where they are affiliated to the Alliance may ask to have such Clubs accepted into PAGB Competitions, but each must be specifically agreed by the PAGB Executive Committee."

Only Clubs who fall within these definitions can be insured, under the PAGB agreed policies, and only such Clubs will be able to be members of, or compete in SPF or PAGB Competitions.

If this causes a problem for your Club please contact the SPF Treasurer, Libby Smith to discuss as soon as practical please don't wait for renewal time.
